

REVIEW: In late September of 2020 Lexington House of Elkhart, Inc. was awarded a Community Foundation of Elkhart County challenge grant. The grant award is for 3 years totaling \$300,000.00, realized at \$100,000.00 a year. As you may recall, challenge grants work like this: in a year's time when you raise a set amount of money (example \$100K), you become eligible to draw down the same amount from the Community Foundation's challenge grant. Then you are eligible to advance to the next year allotted of the grant to raise the next 100k to get 100k.

CURRENTLY: We just finished-up year two of the three year challenge grant, and we did it again raising 100k to get 100k! To all who contributed and made this possible, please accept this THANK YOU!
