

Recipe Corner: Pull Apart Christmas Tree

- 7 mozzarella sticks
- All purpose flour, for dusting
- 1 lb. store bought or home made pizza dough, room temperature
- 1 large egg
- 4 Tbsp. melted butter
- 1 oz parmesan, finely grated
- 1 Tbsp. finely chopped parsley
- 1 Tbsp. finely chopped rosemary
- 1 oz. thinly sliced fresh basil
- Crushed red pepper flakes & warm marinara (for serving)

- 1. Arrange a rack in center of oven, preheat to 450. Cut each cheese stick into 5 pieces.
- 2. On a lightly floured surface, divide dough in half. Roll each piece into an 18" x 4" rectangle. Cut into 2" squares (you'll need 33). Wrap each square around a piece of mozzarella and form a tightly sealed ball.
- 3. Arrange balls of dough, seam side down and touching, on a parchment—lined baking sheet in a Christmas Tree pattern.
- 4. In a small bowl, beat egg with 1 Tbsp. water. Brush egg wash on dough balls.
- 5. Bake tree until golden, 15 to 20 minutes.
- 6. In a small bowl, whisk butter,
 Parmesan, parsley, rosemary, and basil;
 brush on tree. Sprinkle with Parmesan,
 parsley, and red pepper flakes. Serve
 with marinara on the side.
